21' HERRESHOFF "LUCY" FOR SALE

The Toms River Seaport Society has decided to sell its beautiful 21' Herreshoff sloop, "Lucy."

The boat is in immaculate condition, having been completely restored in 2014 by de Rouville's Boat Shop.

Originally owned by Slade Dale, she was built in 1951 and has sailed off and on for 60 years on the Barnegat Bay. She was the featured boat at Toms River Seaport Society's 2014 Wooden Boat Festival.

SHOP TALK

This winter did not deter myself and Trustee Gary Moon from continuing boat restorations and general maintenance around the Seaport. We began restoration work on a Members Shellback Dinghy. There was a section of the bottom near the stern that had to be cut out and replaced. It was a section about 15 x 15 inches. We fit a new piece in and fastened it in place with epoxy and a few copper nails. There were several other areas that did not need to be replaced, but required several coats of epoxy with filler. Once all the patching was completed inside and out, the entire boat was sanded and primed. We used cuprous oxide blue on the bottom to help deter any marine growth. The rest of the boat was painted with marine wood paint, matched closely to the boats original colors.

Next we began work on a 16 foot plywood Hankin's Rowboat. Both sides of the hull had deteriorated to the point that they both need to be removed and replaced. Thus far we have completely removed the starboard side. We are leaving the port side in place as reference while we complete the starboard side.


For a couple of years there has been a very nice Whitehall Rowing Skiff stored in the shed under cover. We are in the process of building a cradle for it and hope to find a place for it in the Spy Building.



Finally we are continuing work on fixing and painting the two boat sheds began last fall. As always we are seeking Member volunteers to help with the tasks around the Seaport. In addition to continuing work on the projects mentioned, we will need volunteers to help with opening the outdoor museum for the 2021 season and ongoing maintenance of our fleet.

The workshop schedule is Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10am to 2pm. Please consider volunteering; no experience is required.


